

Where are we?



What is the FDOT Work Program?

- ◆ Required by F.S. 338 and 339
- ◆ Determines which projects will be provided during the relevant five-year period
- ◆ Determines when the project will be provided (year)
- ◆ Determines how the project will be funded using available revenue



What are the project phases?

- ◆ Planning
- ◆ PD&E
- ◆ Preliminary Engineering
- ◆ Right of Way
- ◆ Construction



How does FDOT fund projects?

- ◆ State funds from the State Transportation Trust Fund (STTF)
- ◆ Federal Funds



Who is involved in the Work Program Process?

- ◆ The Department
 - FDOT Executive Committee
 - Central Office for statewide programs
 - Districts (7) and the Turnpike Enterprise
- ◆ MPO (26 MPO priority lists)
- ◆ Local Governments (67 County Governments)



Who is involved in the Work Program Process?

- ◆ Legislative Committees
- ◆ The Federal Government
- ◆ Florida Transportation Commission
- ◆ Executive Office of the Governor
- ◆ General Public



Development of the Work Program

- ◆ Tentative Work Program
 - Five Year plan that does not include the current year
 - Submitted to the Secretary of Transportation to be adopted July 1st
- ◆ Adopted Work Program
 - Five Year Work Program approved by the Secretary of Transportation on July 1st of each year. Includes current year plus 4 years.




What influences the Work Program Process?

- ◆ Partner Coordination




What is needed by 2040?




What is Cost Feasible?

How does a SIS project get prioritized?

- ◆ “Bottoms Up” combined with “top down” process
- ◆ District Input
- ◆ Statewide Input



How does a SIS project get prioritized?

- ◆ Public Transportation Modes on SIS
 - Statewide modal plans have policy guidance
 - Statewide advisory committees
 - Projects identified on annual basis with modal partners
 - Each mode uses certain factors to select projects
 - Mode-specific analyses, tools being developed or enhanced



How does a SIS project get prioritized?

- ◆ Highway
 - Strategic Investment Tool (SIT)
 - Based on 6 goals of the FTP
 - Maintain and operate Florida's transportation system proactively
 - Improve mobility and connectivity for people and freight
 - Invest in a transportation systems to support a prosperous, globally competitive economy
 - Provide a safe and secure transportation system for all users
 - Make transportation decisions to support and enhance livable communities
 - Make transportation decisions to promote responsible environmental stewardship




How does a SIS project get prioritized?

- ◆ Production readiness
- ◆ Project cost and availability of partner financial contributions
- ◆ Balance of quick fix and long term capacity improvements
- ◆ Reasonable distribution of investments geographically
