Express Lanes Overview

- Provide Motorists with Choices
- Predictable Travel Times
- Dynamically Priced Toll
- Serve Longer, more Regional Trips
 - Typically at a minimum skip two interchanges
 - Segments are approximately 5.0 miles in length
- Deliver a Long-Term Solution to Manage Traffic Flow
 - Generally the last widening project for the roadway
 - ROW is cost-prohibited or has substantial impacts
- Improve Operations of the Existing Travel Lanes
 - By Removing cars from the General Use Lanes













Express Lanes Overview

- Can still Provide Additional General Purpose Lanes
 - Last widening project?
 - Express Lanes Work Safe and Operationally at the begin/end
- Projects that are Adding General Purpose Lanes
 - I-10 from I-95 to I-10/I-95 Split











Express Lanes in D2 – Under Construction

- Cost \$262 Million
- Length 5.1 Miles
- Construction funded FY 2021



Commitment of the First Coast Expressway PD&E Study

I-95 from International Golf Pkwy to I-295

- Cost \$472 Million
- Length 14.0 Miles
- Construction funded FY 2022 & 2023















Express Lanes in D2 – Missing Gap




Express Lanes in D2 – PD&E Study




I-10 & I-295 Western Beltway Planning Studies

Recent Challenges

- Separation Type
 - Barrier vs. Express Lane Markers
 - Differential in Speeds from Express to General Use Lanes
- Entrance (Ingress)/Exit (Egress) locations
 - Direct Connect Ramps
 - Weaving
 - Existing Closely Spaced Interchanges Further Complicates Access Locations



Project Overview

- Originally Ran as a Capacity Project to Widen to 8 or 10 Lanes
 - ETDM Number 11440
- SIMR Approval
 - October 17, 2016
- NEPA Approval
 - One of our first NEPA assignment projects
 - Approved March 3, 2017
- Reevaluation Needed
 - Working to update typical & concept to include barrier separation
 - Express lanes limits have been modified












Challenges - Where to terminate Express

 - Southside Connector












Express Lanes in D2 – Funded for Construction

 - ROW primarily for ponds only
- Held several public meetings
 - Comments Focused on Noise Walls
 - Concerns Regarding High Crash Segment
