

What is ETDM?

Florida's Efficient Transportation Decision Making (ETDM) Process is a new way of accomplishing transportation planning and project development for major capacity improvement projects. The ETDM Process enables agencies and the public to provide early input to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) about potential effects of proposed transportation projects. The goal of ETDM is to make transportation decisions more quickly without sacrificing the quality of the human and natural environments.



How Can the Public Get Involved?


Early in the planning process, the public and District-wide Environmental Technical Advisory Teams (ETATs) review projects for potential environmental effects. The ETAT consists of government representatives with statutory authority for issuing permits or providing environmental consultation. At the same time they are notified to review a project, the public is informed that the project information is available for their review on the ETDM Web site or through the MPO or FDOT District Office.



Members of the public provide comments through workshops, correspondence, telephone communication, and emails. ETDM Coordinators summarize and provide feedback



through the ETDM Web site and the FDOT District Office. All the project information continues to be available and updated as the project progresses.


How to Use the Interactive Map Viewer

Open the map by clicking on the Interactive Mapper option found under ETDM Maps (in the top tool bar). If you have a project selected in the Project Search window, the map will focus on the selected project location.

Zoom in or out by using the slide bar. You can also zoom in by clicking on the map with the left mouse button. Right-click on the map and select "Full Extent" to zoom out to the Florida boundary.

Move around the map (pan) by left-clicking on the map, holding down the mouse button, and dragging the map to the desired position.

Use the options in the Map Tool Bar to open mini-tool windows:

- Map Search (shown) - find a location on the map by address, zip code, FDOT district, county, city, or water management district.
- Map Info - list and change which data layers are shown on the map, view the map legend, or display more information about a data layer.
- Print - produce a PDF file of the map with various size and orientation options.
- Help - learn more about using the interactive map viewer.
